

Welcome to Maxwell Hall Riding Trails

- Park Membership is required to enter and use facility
- Member stickers must be displayed on the left rear side of all horse trailers entering the park
- Members are responsible for keeping gate closed and locked during and after use
- Riders are required to possess current negative coggins certificate for all horses and ponies
- **Annual memberships with trailer stickers and gate lock combinations are available for a fee of \$25.00. Please contact the Dept. of Recreation, Parks & Tourism at (301) 934-9305 or (301) 932-1083; or complete and mail in the membership application (available at the Maxwell Hall Park's information Board).

~Know the Rules~

- Park is open 8 A.M. - Dusk; After hours use is prohibited
- Riders are responsible for any damage incurred by their horses
- Trailer parking in designated lots only
- Marked trails only; Riding in unmarked areas and crop lands is strictly prohibited
- No motorized vehicles or bicycles on trails
- Pets must be kept on a leash at all times
- No alcoholic beverages
- No glass containers
- No open fires
- Please don't litter; Dispose of manure, hay, etc. in designated bins
- All visitors use facilities at their own risk
- All riders under 18 must be accompanied by an adult

Driving directions from Waldorf:

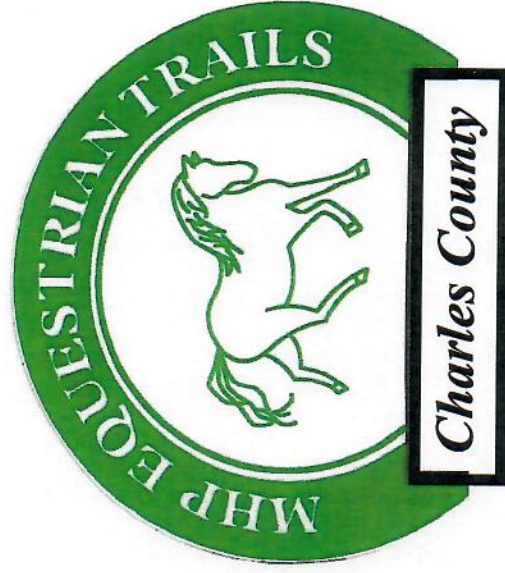
- Take route 5 south to Hughesville
- Take a left at the 231 intersection
- Follow 231 to Maxwell Drive (on left)
- Take Maxwell Drive to the very end
- The park is located at the end of Maxwell Drive

- Drinking water is not available

Yellow Trail - (1.3 Miles) First trail you encounter on the Main Trail; Riders travel along the edge of the field/woods area.
Connects to Blue Trail or follow to the end, back onto Main Trail.
* Features a cross country jump course.

Orange Trail - (2.3 Miles) Challenging trail; Riders travel through woods up and down (steep) hills and some forge areas.
* Features The Trail Course.

Blue Trail - (2.8 Miles) Starts/Ends on Main Trail (Connects with Yellow Trail). Riders travel along edge of Field/woods area.
* Features Beach Rest Area.

Red Trail - (1.8 Miles) Last trail along the Main Trail; (Starts/Ends). Riders travel along the edge of a field/woods area, and shore line.
* Features a Rest Area

Green Trail - (2.8 Miles) Starts off the Orange Trail in the woods. Riders travel through the woods /fields; moderate hills.
* Leads to Waterfront Rest Area

Brown Trail - (3.5 Miles) Most challenging trail; Starts off of the Green Trail. Riders Travel through woods up and down (steep) hills, and some ford areas.
* Features two Rest Areas / Scenic Overlooks

Maxwell Hall Park - Equestrian Area Regulations

Park membership is required to enter and use facility

Trails for Equestrian and Hiking Use Only - No bike riding permitted.

Member stickers must be displayed on the left rear side of all horse trailers entering park.

Members are responsible for keeping gate closed and locked during and after use.

Park is open 8:00 A.M. - Dusk

**After hours use is prohibited

Park is closed Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.

During periods of inclement weather/ poor trail conditions, it may be necessary to close this facility; signs will be posted at entrance.

This facility is open for informal day use, unless there is a scheduled event which has been permitted through the Department of Recreation, Parks and Tourism.

Trailer parking is allowed in designated lot only.

No motorized vehicles on trails.

All visitors use the facilities at their own risk.

All riders under the age of 18 must be accompanied an adult.

Please dispose of manure, hay, etc. in designated bins.

Pets must be on a leash at all times.

Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.

No glass containers.

No open fires.

Riders are required to have a current negative coggins certificate for all horses and ponies.

All riders must stay on designated/ marked trails only.

Riding in unmarked areas and crop lands is strictly prohibited.

Damage/ vandalism should be reported to park staff immediately (301) 932-1083.

The park staff are the authorized agents of the C.C. Department of Recreation, Parks and Tourism. Directions of park staff are to be followed.
